I know many same sex couples who are living together, some for many years. They are all respected citizens but they are denied the right to get married because of the Marriage Act 1961 that defines marriage as a union between a man and a woman. Unlike many countries and states around the world I believe this limitation discriminates against the many same-sex couples in Australia who should be entitled to marriage equality and the legal benefits, if that is what they desire.
