


Support For A Coalition Conscience Vote On Same-Sex Marriage

Commissioned by: Australian Marriage Equality November 2011







1. Methodology





Methodology

- ▶ This study was conducted on the Galaxy Online Omnibus on the weekend of 25-27 November 2011.
- ▶ The sample was 1,051 Australians aged 18 years and over, distributed throughout Australia, as follows:

NSW/ACT	313
Victoria/Tasmania	300
Queensland	194
South Australia	121
Western Australia	123

- Age, gender and region quotas were applied to the sample.
- ▶ Following the completion of interviewing, the data was weighted by age, gender and region to reflect the latest ABS population estimates.







2. Main Findings





Main Findings

- ▶ Four in five (80%) of Australians believe that The Coalition should have a conscience vote on a bill to allow same-sex couples to marry.
- Importantly, three quarters (76%) of Australians who support The Coalition say that The Coalition should have a conscience vote on the matter.
- ▶ Support for a conscience vote among the Coalition is strongest among supporters of The Greens (91%) and supporters of The Australian Labor Party (89%).
- ▶ Support for the conscience vote is also higher among 18-24 year olds (87%), and females (85% compared to 74% of men).

Tables

▶ The tables of findings are set out such that they include the following details:

1 BASE: Weight Sample (000's):

The number of completed interviews has been weighted to reflect the latest ABS population estimates. These estimates are shown in thousands (000's). The percentages in the table are based on these weighted figures.

2 WEIGHTS:

This indicates that in order to reflect the latest ABS population estimates the data has been weighted by age, gender and area.

3 FILTERS (Where applicable):

If the table is based on a subset of respondents then this will be titled as a Filter and accompanied by a description of the sample upon which the table is based.

4 RESPONDENTS:

These figures show the actual sample size, indicating the total number of respondents who were asked the relevant question.
